Reporting to the Medical Director, the Palliative Medicine Specialist will provide high standards of medical care within a holistic Hospice service.

This position is primarily responsible for but not limited to;

- Specialist assessment and management of patients both in community settings and the inpatient unit of Totara Hospice
- Providing specialist palliative care advice to external health professionals on patient care
- Provide ongoing assessment of patients in day hospice programmes, and outpatient clinics or on domiciliary visits
- Provide on-call duty service after hours
- Provide clinical cross cover for the Hospital Palliative Care Team (HPCT) of Middlemore Hospital when required
- Contribute where appropriate to Hospice clinical, educational & research activities
- Actively participate in the strategic direction of the organization and the smooth running of the medical team

Our challenging demographical environment is clinically stimulating, and you really do feel like you are making a difference. While being pushed to the upper limits of your scope of practice and creativity, you will learn and develop as a patient-centred clinician.

The successful candidate must have:

- Specialist qualification in Palliative Medicine, recognised by the RACP (Royal Australasian College of Physicians) and the MCNZ (Medical Council of New Zealand)

- Excellent English language communication skills – both verbal and written
- Experience in both hospital and hospice settings would be an added advantage
- Minimum 2 years' post-specialist qualification in a credentialed palliative care institution would be useful, but we have some flexibility for the right candidate.
